The goal of *Church* is not just *fun*, though we hope you enjoy our time together. God started the *Church* and He meets us here every time to encourage and build us up, so we are prepared for everything headed our way. - Receiving all sorts of blessings given by God.

The Lord's Supper

In the Lord's Supper, the Lord gives us His Body and His Blood with the bread and the wine. Because receiving Communion together publicly declares that we are in full community with each another, if you would like to receive the Lord's Supper at **Zion**, please chat with Pastor before the service to find out what Scripture teaches and why we believe it.

If you need gluten-free bread, let Pastor know. The light-colored cups in the middle of the tray are alcohol-free, if you prefer that.

Parents of Little Ones:

Welcome to **Zion** and relax! God gives our children energy to explore the world and He loves it!

The activity and sounds of your children prove that the Church is where life happens.

As children wiggle, giggle, and talk during Church, they are learning how to worship and that God loves them *just as they are*.

How do you help them learn to worship? Well,

b Making **the Sign of the Cross** was a Church-wide practice by AD 150 as described by Tertullian, an ancient Church leader. Even Martin Luther said it is a good thing to do as we remember that we have put on Christ—*Romans 13, Galatians 3*

God uses challenges to complete and perfect us.

¹Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.ⁱ ²Through Him, we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ³Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit^j who has been given to us.

- ^a The **Old Testament** is the part of the Bible written before Jesus walked the Earth.
- b **Abram** is the famous Abraham of the Bible. This name means, "exalted father."
- "Yahweh" is the personal name of God in the Old Testament which He used to refer to Himself 6,828 times. This name is Hebrew, the original language of the Old Testament, and it means "The One who was, is, and always will be" and is pronounced, "Yah-way."
- ^d A **covenant** is an unchangeable contract. Breaking a covenant meant death.
- e Abraham means, "father of a multitude," pointing to the promises of God that his descendants would be more numerous than stars in the sky and sand on the seashore. All Christians are descendants of Abraham—Romans 4:12, Galatians 3:7–9 and 4:31.
- f Sarai means "princess."
- ⁹ Sarah means "princess of Yahweh."
- h An "**Epistle**" is a letter. This is from a letter Paul wrote to Christians living in Rome and to us as well.
- "**Christ**" is the Greek word for the Hebrew word "Messiah," both of which mean "the One anointed by God to save the world."
- This "**Holy Spirit**" is not just some sort of "spirituality," but it is God the Holy Spirit, the Third Person in the Trinity that is God, who offers to dwell inside of us to give us hope, joy, faith, Heaven, and so much more.

Gift #4: A Reading from the Holy Gospelsa

Mark 5:1–20, from around AD 30

Jesus cast out a legion of demons and defeated them... with just His words.

- P The Holy Gospel, according to St. Mark, the fifth chapter.

¹Jesus and His followers came to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, to the country of the Gerasenes ²and, when Jesus had stepped out of the boat, immediately there met Him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit—³he lived among the tombs and no one could bind him anymore, not even with a chain, ⁴for he had often been bound with shackles and chains, but he wrenched the chains apart and he broke the shackles in pieces. No one had the strength to subdue him. ⁵Night and day, among the tombs and on the mountains, he was always crying out and cutting himself with stones.

⁶And when he saw Jesus from afar, he ran and fell down before Him ⁷and, crying out with a loud voice, he said, "What have You to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I adjure You by God, do not torment me," ⁸for He was saying to him, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!" ^b ⁹And Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" He replied, "My name is Legion, ^c for we are many," ¹⁰and he begged Him earnestly not to send them out of the country. ¹¹Now, a great herd of pigs was feeding there on the hillside ¹²and they begged Him, saying, "Send us to the pigs; let us enter them," ¹³so He gave them permission and the unclean spirits came out and entered the pigs; and the herd, numbering about two thousand, rushed down the steep bank into the sea and drowned in the sea.

¹⁴The herdsmen fled and told it in the city and in the country and people came to see what it was that had happened ¹⁵and they came to Jesus and saw the demon-possessed man, the one who had had the legion, sitting there, clothed and in his right mind, and they were afraid ¹⁶and those who had seen it described to them what had happened to the demon-possessed man and to the pigs ¹⁷and they began to beg Jesus to depart from their region. ¹⁸As He was getting into the boat, the man who had been possessed with demons begged Him that he might be with Him ¹⁹and He did not permit him but said to him, "Go home to your friends and tell them how much the Lord has done for you and how He has had mercy on you," ²⁰and he went away and began to proclaim in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him and everyone marveled.

- **P** This is the Gospel of the Lord.
- Praise to You, O Christ.

^a "Gospel" is an ancient word meaning "good news" and has come to mean a biography of Jesus.

b An **unclean spirit** is a demon and, yes, they exist. Demon-possession is still extremely common today in Asia, Africa, and South America. Even today, modern missionaries regularly cast out demons and this has been well-documented—Craig Keener, *Miracles: The Credibility of the New Testament Accounts*, 2 volumes (Ada, MI: Baker Academic, 2011), 1,248 pages.

 $^{^{\}rm c}$ At this time, a **legion** consisted of 5,800 soldiers in the Roman infantry.

b "Laud" means "to praise loudly and publicly."

^c "Sanctus" means "Holy" in Latin, which was the primary language of the Church in Europe from around AD 395 until AD 1520, when many congregations began to worship God in the locally spoken languages, such as German and English. In the Sanctus, the word "Sabaoth" means "Heavenly Hosts" and "Hosanna" means "please save us" in Hebrew, the original language of the Old Testament.

^a "Pax Domini" means "The peace of the Lord" in Latin, which was the primary language of the Church in Europe from around AD 395 until AD 1520. This "The peace of the Lord be with you" greeting has been used daily and weekly throughout the Church since Jesus greeted His closest followers on the evening of the first Easter, April 5, AD 33—John 20:21.

Why do we not say "Alleluia" during Lent?

In the worship service, we often call out to each other saying, "Alleluia!" which is an invitation in Hebrew (the original language of the Old Testament) to one another to "Praise the Lord!" This word appears in the Psalms 24 times and in Revelation 4 times, where the writers are celebrating the work and salvation of God. Normally, on Sundays, we sing "Alleluia" just before the reading from one of the Gospels (the biographies of Jesus which are in the Bible).

Since Lent is a time of intentional mindfulness of our relationship with God and how we often fall short, our worship services during Lent have a much more serious feeling. Therefore, by AD 450, the Church began to "bury" or put away the Alleluia and a few other celebration pieces during Lent. Even though Lent is a very serious time, we know that we are just weeks away from singing the Alleluia again, because Easter is just around the corner.

(It is great, though, to say and sing "Alleluia" during **Lent** if you are rehearsing for **Easter** songs and programs, especially for people in Sunday Schools and Church Choirs!)



For full transparency and clarity, as examples, each year, the "Parish" part of our ministry together has covered the full \$14,000 of our Property Insurance and Workers' Compensation Insurance, though that insurance covers all our Staff members, including *Preschool Staff* and Café Staff members. The same is true for maintenance costs and the wages of various staff members, such as our Facility Administrator (\$13,000), etc. As we improve our allocation plan this year, we will continue to report our ministry impacts, fruitfulness, and challenges each week with this new "One Glimpse of Our Ministry Together" report. One Glimpse of Our Ministry Together *In January, together, we:* **Baptized Vera Kimberly Mueller, Baptized Andrew Thomas Sullivan,** averaged 111 people in worship with The Lord's Supper, averaged 34 livestream views each Sunday, served 78 in Bible Study and Sunday School (35%), served 95 drinks and 32 snacks each day, counseled 56 people (57% from outside of Zion), served 19 Preschool children from 18 families, did 15 home and hospital visits, ministered to 9 police officers, offered up \$16,943.92 in offerings, received \$16,975.70 in Café sales, received \$5,030.95 in tuition, for a total gain of \$38,950.57, and spent \$40,285.16, putting **Zion** at -\$1,334.59 YTD.
