What do you love about our worship services?

Responses from a Voters' Meeting at Zion Lutheran, Maryland Heights, on June 19, AD 2021

At the Zion Voters' Meeting on June 19, AD 2021, Pastor Femmel said at Thanksgiving Dinner at Grandma's House no one enjoys every food and dessert on the table. We all have our favorites. When one person's favorite is not something you enjoy, instead of taking someone else's favorite off the table, it is the path of love to let others have their favorites on the table and that they let you have your favorites on the table as well, side by side.

In worship, we can get confused and think that if something pleases me, it must also please God and, therefore, if I don't like something, then it must be wrong. We often mistake **our** preferences of style and genre as being **God's** preferences. Pastor discussed Acts 15 and shared that God works through old music, new music, traditions, and new ideas.

Pastor then asked,

"What do you love about our worship services? What parts do you deeply value?"

Here is a summary of the responses:

<u>Matthew and Reilly Brynildsen</u> really appreciate the **contemporary music** and also appreciate the **traditional hymns**. They love that it is **a mix of old and new** most of all. Their young son even sings the contemporary songs later on during the day and week because he really enjoys them, too.

Jan Foss really appreciates the **blended services** having both the **beloved hymns** and the more **contemporary songs** at the services. Like David who played the lyre and even danced, we should praise God and not get stuck in any particular style of music.

<u>Nancy Cooper</u> likes the **contemporary music**. It was the words and the music of contemporary that got her through the things she is going through right now and helped her find Jesus. She says her soul was saved by contemporary music and she loves enjoying that when she gets to be in God's House.

<u>Mary Beth Mayer</u> likes the **traditional music**, but she also really enjoys the **contemporary music** because it is fun and definitely reaches and brings in young people. She listens to contemporary music all week long. She also loves the **great family atmosphere** of Zion.

<u>Nick Otz</u> really enjoys **both styles of music** which we use. The words touch him.

Lori Otz loves getting the Lord's Supper every week.

<u>Susie Kitrel</u> likes the **traditional hymns** because she knows them by heart and even some of the **older contemporary songs** because she is not very familiar with the newer contemporary songs. She also likes **the "Why do we...?" explanations** in the bulletin because they give her knowledge of Church history which she never knew about before, so now each service is more meaningful for her.
